

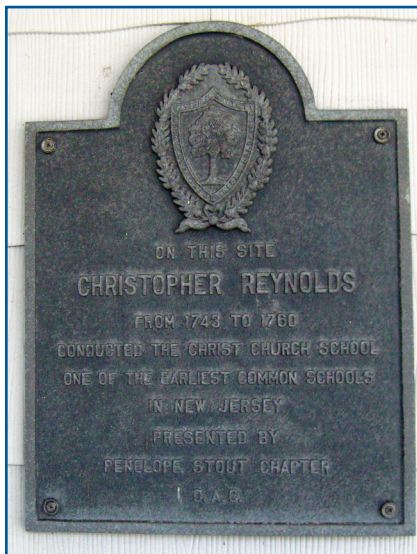

Christin Vivona, a graduate student from Monmouth University, will speak on her research at Christ Church about people and history illuminating an important time in Shrewsbury's past, including:

- How the separation of Shrewsbury's and Freehold's parishes parted ways due to the behavior of Reverend John Miln
- How Josiah Holmes's personal feud with Reverend Samuel Cooke resulted in his resignation as churchwarden and his fervent fight as a patriot during the Revolutionary War
- How rumors that a known criminal would be placed as a priest at Christ Church crippled the church's mission to buy an income property and diminished the trust between the parishioners and their missionaries
